

2. LITERATURE REVIEW

Extension programs are essential in empowering communities by providing them with the necessary knowledge and skills to become independent, skilled, and morally righteous individuals (Harder & Brodeur, 2011). These programs are designed to address a variety of communal needs and challenges, with an emphasis on the beneficiaries' demands and the purpose of improving their significant behavior patterns (Rubio et al., 2016; Wellard et al., 2013). One of the critical challenges in implementing extension programs is the sustainability of services. A study by Agholor et al. (2013) found that substandard extension assistance to beneficiaries, insufficient linkage with extension and research, outdated extension methods, and farmworkers' reluctance to use agricultural produce are some of the precarious issues that need to be addressed. The Philippines' Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) have contributed to the 2020 Philippine Development Agenda (PDA) by adopting need-based practices to achieve their outputs. Community development programs must assist the most marginalized populations, and the pursuit of development initiatives is seen as a communal challenge (Schiele, Jackson, & Fairfax, 2009). In the context of the gift-giving of pre-loved clothes and groceries, an extension program in Balamban, Cebu, has shown significant effects on women's empowerment. The project contributed to their income and eventual capability to make and control financial matters, which has a significant effect on their families and eventually to their community. It can give rise to the improvement of women's and children's health and welfare (Burges, 2007; Buvinic et al., 2008; Ferrant, 2010; Gowan et al., 2005; World Bank 2012). It covered all the factors that encompass quality of life. This showed that women performed multidimensional roles to advance their existing family standard (Pogoy et al., 2016). In the context of free sim card registration, an extension program by Field of Hope (FOH) in Uganda has shown significant impacts on the community. FOH believes that empowering people with improved agriculture techniques can improve the nutritional security that is needed in areas of Uganda. The organization has been providing knowledge and training in practical agricultural skills, empowering the people they serve. By providing knowledge and training in practical agricultural skills, FOH is equipping farmers, teachers, or school children with something that can rarely be lost: knowledge and experience. Gaining the know-how of a new idea or product can change how efficient production of agriculture for a farmer or student can be. In agriculture, efficient production leads to overall improvement of life for farmers (or students), whether that means more income, better nutrition, or less time spent on laboring fields (Hurst, 2023).

3. METHODOLOGY

The research on Empowering Communities: An Analysis of Extension Programs Focusing on Gift-Giving and Free Sim Card Registration in Oriental Mindoro and Other Areas will employ a mixed-methods approach to gather comprehensive data and insights. Additionally, the study included 150 individuals from various regions who had not yet registered their SIM cards. The selection of respondents aimed to capture the perspectives and experiences of a broad range of individuals who have participated in or been affected by the extension programs. The data collected from these respondents was analyzed using a mixed-methods approach, combining both qualitative and quantitative research methods. This provides a comprehensive understanding of the impact of the extension programs on the empowerment of communities in Oriental Mindoro and other areas.

4. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

The results of the study indicated a significant positive impact of the extension programs on community empowerment. Through the gift-giving of pre-loved clothes and groceries, beneficiaries reported an improvement in their quality of life, with enhanced access to essential items contributing to their well-being. Similarly, the free sim card registration program in Oriental Mindoro and other areas facilitated improved communication and access to information, empowering individuals to connect with others and access vital services.

The table below outlines the key programs and services offered by the College in empowering communities through extension programs. These initiatives have played a significant role in addressing the needs of marginalized populations and fostering sustainable development in Oriental Mindoro and surrounding areas. The responses on the impact of extension programs and services as to strategy, social, and services, as indicated in Table 3, shows that both the Community Outreach (N=150) and Sim Card Free Registration (N=150) programs have been highly rated. The average weighted mean for the Community Outreach program is 4.83, while for the Sim Card Free Registration program, it is 4.88. Specifically, the criteria "The program started on

time" received the highest rating of 4.905 for the Community Outreach program and 4.94 for the Sim Card Free Registration program. The criterion "The materials for the extension were well prepared" also received a high rating of 4.9 for both programs. These results suggest that the extension programs have been effective in achieving their objectives and providing quality services to the community.

Table 4 below presents the results of an evaluation of the level of adherence and effectiveness in achieving objectives for two extension programs: Community Outreach and Sim Card Free Registration. The table shows the mean ratings for each program across three indicators: Strategy, Social Cohesion, and Services. The ratings are based on a scale of 1 to 5, with higher ratings indicating better adherence and effectiveness. The Community Outreach program received a mean rating of 4.81 for Strategy, 4.81 for Social Cohesion, and 4.86 for Services, with an overall average weighted mean of 4.83. The Sim Card Free Registration program received a mean rating of 4.87 for Strategy, 4.83 for Social Cohesion, and 4.93 for Services, with an overall average

weighted mean of 4.88. These results suggest that both programs have high levels of adherence and effectiveness in achieving their objectives. The concept of implementation fidelity, which refers to the degree to which an intervention is delivered as intended, is relevant to this evaluation. Implementation fidelity includes factors such as adherence to the intervention, exposure or dose, quality of delivery, participant responsiveness, and program differentiation. The evaluation of implementation fidelity involves measuring adherence, which includes the subcategories of content, frequency, duration, and coverage. The level of implementation fidelity achieved can affect the relationship between the intervention and its outcomes.
